Directions for Writing Color Poems

Look at the pattern for the color poem below. The poem begins with a metaphor that gives a feeling about the color according to the poet. The next three lines are similes that give examples or supporting details about the first line.

metaphor Yellow is happiness

simile like time spent with my best friend

simile like a day in the summer sun

simile as warm as a purring kitten in my lap

Try this: (Don't worry if you don't like brown, you can choose to write about a different color later.)

- 1. Brainstorm in either a list or web form things that are brown. (Some suggestions: mud, chocolate, my cat, dead leaves, my favorite sweater.) Try to look beyond the obvious.
- 2. Find a feeling or character attribute that generalizes the ideas you have about brown. (Mine is warmth.)
- 3. Write that general statement as a metaphor: Brown is _____.
- 4. Write two or three events or experiences that support your main idea.



Here is my finished poem:

Brown is warmth

like the newly turned over soil in my garden

like my favorite sweater

as comforting as a cup of hot chocolate on a cool day.
